

SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!

Goeglein's Catering is the sole provider of catering service and room rental of the Imperial Rom.

All requests for Reservations for the use of Mizpah's Imperial Room must be processed through Goeglein's Catering.

For any and all open dates Goeglein's reserves first right to the date requested.

Member Use

Nobles of Mizpah Shrine will receive a member discount with the following criteria met.

- 1. Noble must be requesting discount for immediate family member only. Cousins, nieces, brother, sister, or other family members will not be allowed a discount.
- 2. Mizpah member will notify Goeglein's of intent to request discount. Goeglein's will contact the Potentate for approval. Once approval is provided Goeglein's will adjust room rental at time account settlement is made.

Other Masonic Bodies Use

While at times other Masonic bodies may request use of the Imperial Room it will be solely Goeglein's and the Potentates discretion for use on the date requested and what charges will be applies. Our goal is to work together for mutual use of the Imperial Room. All efforts will be made to accommodate all parties.

Club/Unit Ballroom Use

- 1. Clubs and units desiring use of the Imperial Room for a club or unit function must first contact Goeglein's to determine open date and room availability. No room charge will be made.
- 2. Carry in of food is allowed, ie "pot luck" or items provided by club/unit members. All catered items must be purchased from Goeglein's. No other food items may be purchased and delivered. **Alcohol carry in is not permitted by State law.** Mizpah's bar staff is available for refreshment service with prior to the event arrangements made. Goeglein's also can provide beverages at an additional cost if desired.
- 3. Club or unit requesting and using the Imperial Room will be responsible for set up of the room for their use.
- 4. Club or unit using the room will be responsible for leaving the room set up as found and clean. A cleaning charge of \$150.00 will be assessed if the ball room and catering kitchen not clean.

Goeglein's is responsible for booking all events to be held at the Imperial Room. Often these dates are booked one to two years out. Every effort will be made to accommodate clubs and units as requested but will be subject to prior bookings. Should a dispute arise the Potentate and Goeglein's will make all final decisions.

Every effort has been made to include all known events throughout the year. All clubs and units are requested to provide the Potentate in writing their requested date for the following year on or before December 15th. The current potentate will provide the requests to the current chef rabban for inclusion in the following year's calendar. Requests for dates received after the 15th will be "as available" and subject to prior bookings by Goeglein's and or clubs and units who submitted their requests.

Moving the Khyber trophies and deceased member name plates continues to be a problem. Hopefully warm weather will facilitate the movement.



Preserving Our Past.....

The Grandfather Clock has been moved to it's new home at the Mizpah Shrine Center



The Furtwängler and Son clock factory or Uhrenfabrik (German for clock factory, direct English translation is hour maker) was located in Furtwangen, Germany, and founded in 1836. Sons of Theophil, Hector, Oskar and Aldof all clockmakers joined the father's enterprise in 1868 and the company changed to Uhrenfabrik L. Furtwängler & Sohne. Because they were makers of clocks which possessed top precision in workmanship, movements and cases, they became world famous. In 1900, ownership changed hands to A.G. Stockholder Corporation.

Beginning with World War I, the clockmaking was, by law, drastically curtailed; the company did participate in the production within the defense industry. After 1918, the tough competition of mass produced clocks and less expensive movements and close case forced the out of business and all operations stopped in 1929.


The logo will give you the date between 1881 and 1925 for production of that movement, the logo was changed in 1925 to just read FURTWANGLER. The size of the escapewheel on the logo changed in 1885 from smaller than a dime to about the size of a dime. This might help with dating it further.






