PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO A SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL

Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!

In July, we were in Elkhart, where we met at the Masonic Temple. We had special speakers and enjoyed a home cooked meal. What a great gathering. If you want to receive information about these meetings so you can attend, please let us know.

Do you know what to say when someone asks, or you want to share, what the Shriners Hospitals do?? If you are like me, I tend to get “tongue-tied” in knowing what to say. Could you share in 30 seconds or less the answers to these questions??? Shriners International, Public Relations Department offers these words:

Shriners Hospitals for Children provides specialized care to children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families’ ability to pay. Generally, care is provided until age 18, although, in some cases, it may be extended to age 21. All care and services are provided in a family-centered environment. Remember, don’t indicate that Shriners Hospitals for Children provides care “for free” or “at no cost.”

Here are quick ways to get more information
