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


POTENTATE'S MESSAGE

You see, I've carried my obligations, For almost fifty years, It has helped me through the hardships and the failures full of tears.


Now I'm losing my mind and body, Death is near but I don't despair, I've lived my life upon the level, And I'm dying upon the square.

Just in case you missed the April meeting, I want you to know how much I appreciated the opportunity to attend the Treasurers meeting in Tampa the end of March. It was extremely informative, not only, from standpoint of my being better equipped to meet the responsibility of treasurer but of informing me that I may be a more useful servant and member of Mizpah.

Let me share with you some information, I believe, you will find very positive. During 2012 there were over 500 Temple hosted charitable fundraisers and over ten million dollars of net proceeds raised for SHC.

The new advertising is working—now with top agency (Leo Burnett). Twenty-three million additional advertising is planned for 2014 bringing The three year total to around 60 million. The result; donations are up 36%.

We are making progress with third-party insurance. From revenue cycle inception through year end 2012, we collected \$169,709,458.29. For 2012 alone, we collected \$95,110,553.66.

Our Achilles heal of which we are all aware is MEMBERSHIP. The Imperial Sir, Al Madson says we need to include the family in our Shrine Centers. Yes we do and I am proud to say Mizpah is aware and has and will continue to move in that direction. Shrinedom is evolving.
