PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO A SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL

Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!

Veterans Day

Veterans Day gives Americans the opportunity to celebrate the bravery and sacrifice of all U.S. veterans. However, most Americans confuse this holiday with Memorial Day, reports the Department of Veterans Affairs.

What's more, some Americans don't really know why we commemorate our Veterans on Nov.11. It's imperative that all Americans know the history of Veterans Day so that we can honor our former service members properly.

A Brief History of Veterans Day

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied nations came into effect. Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, was originally set as a U.S. legal holiday to honor the end of World War I. In legislation that was passed in 1938, November 11 was "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day." As such, this new legal holiday honored World War I veterans.

In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress -- at the urging of the veterans service organizations -- amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, Nov. 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

In 1968, the Uniforms Holiday Bill ensured three-day weekends for federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. Under this bill, Veterans Day was moved to the fourth Monday of October. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holiday on its original date. The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on Oct. 25, 1971.

Finally on September 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a law which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of Nov. 11, beginning in 1978. Since then, the Veterans Day holiday has been observed on Nov. 11.

How many know the difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Telehealth Offers Convenience to Patient Families

Many of the patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children travel great distances to see the specialists at our hospitals and medical centers. The implementation of telehealth services will allow Michigan families to have more convenient visits with their clinicians at Shriners Hospitals and lower transportation costs. A collaboration between the Chicago and Cincinnati Shriners Hospitals for Children, and the Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital in Grand Rapids and Covenant HealthCare in Saginaw, makes this possible.



ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY AIDS CONSULTATIONS

The clinicians at Shriners Hospitals will use state-of-the-art mobile carts and digital health peripherals to connect physicians and appropriate patients by video for both new and follow-up visits. The Shriners Hospitals' medical team examines the child via live video from a private telehealth room at the affiliate location, where they receive our signature high-quality care, just as they would at the Shriners Hospital. Additionally, medical information is transmitted electronically to the consulting provider in real time. "We're committed to serving patients and families with more convenient and flexible care," said Mark Niederpruem, administrator at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago. "Mary Free Bed and Covenant HealthCare provide outstanding rehabilitation for children, and we're pleased to be collectively agile using the latest health care delivery modality."

EXPECT MORE TO COME "Our hospitals have been providing telehealth services throughout the country for nearly a decade," he said. "However, this launch marks an advance in technology and the hospital's agility in the continually changing delivery models for health care. It also launches the first telehealth clinic for the Chicago Shriners Hospital."

Several telehealth sessions have already taken place, and Shriners Hospitals hopes to expand the program in the future.


