Potentate's Message ...

Electione Special Notice ...
 We will not have a stated meeting in December. However, we will have a meeting on Friday, December 1, 2023, for the purpose of electing officers, and representatives for the year 2024. This is not a dinner meeting, the meeting starts at 7:00 pm.
 Imperial Election Regulations 325.11 are as follows:

 (a) Electioneering, A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
 (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
 (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend an offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
 (d) Dues. Current 2023 dues card is necessary for admission.

Gavin, 14, can often be found on the basketball court, riding his bike, or playing golf. He loves to make people laugh and is affectionately known as "Governor Gav" for his ability to make friends with anyone.

In 2009, Gavin became critically ill with meningococcal meningitis. In severe cases, the bacterial infection causes a rash and lesions that can lead to amputations. Gavin went to Shriners Children's Ohio for specialized wound and skin care. He underwent several complex surgeries, including amputation of his right foot in 2019.

Zack will have the experience of a lifetime representing Chicago at the SC Open

Zack, 16, is a high school junior hailing from northern Indiana. Growing up in Amish country, Zack attended a middle school where students learned solely using paper before transitioning to a high school utilizing technology. Zack enjoys hanging out with friends and serves as manager of his baseball team.

Zack has been a patient of Shriners Children's Chicago for eight years alongside his younger brother, with both receiving care for Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease. The condition affects the nerves that can control muscle movement, leading to numbness, muscle weakness, and, in Zack's case, scoliosis. Zack received tendon transfers and reconstruction on both feet, and recently underwent a spinal fusion surgery to address the curvature in his spine. He credits his outstanding nurses and surgical team for going above and beyond.



Paxton's mom calls her experience with Shriners Children's Ohio, DCH 'amazing'

Shriners Children's Ohio's unique hospital-within-ahospital model allows our surgeons to collaborate with Dayton Children's Hospital to treat more complex craniofacial conditions. Sixteen-month-old Paxton was born with craniosynostosis, a condition where the bones in the skull join too early, resulting in a misshapen skull and potentially putting pressure on the brain.

Dr. Chris Gordon and Dr. Rob Lober, a neurosurgeon at Dayton Children's Hospital, performed a surgery to relieve the pressure and fitted Paxton for a helmet to help reshape his skull.

Cleft lip and palate treatment journey has many experts who help along the way

For a child with a cleft diagnosis, the medical journey can span their entire childhood. The multidisciplinary team at Shriners Children's Chicago guides families in the timing of procedures and surgical approaches to improve their child's physical health – eating, hearing, breathing and speaking – while also creating the best possible appearance.

While nearly all children who have a cleft will need braces (orthodontia), a smaller percentage also need teeth repair or replacement. David Reisberg, DDS, at Shriners Children's Chicago, is one of a few hundred specially trained prosthodontists in the country. "If there's a cleft lip involved, patients are usually missing at least one tooth in the cleft site, sometimes more. And if it's a bilateral, they may be missing one on each side," said Reisberg.
