

There is no limit to the amount of good we can do if we don't care who gets the credit.



Legion of Honor

Decorating the graves of the recently deceased is an ancient custom. Most cultures had traditions for memorializing them. Traces of flowers have been found in Neanderthal burial sites. But remembrance was usually limited to the life spans of the contemporaries. Continuing memorials are relatively modern developments. A holiday for decorating the graves of Americans who died in service to their country dates from the Civil War. At least 25 communities claim credit for originating the practice. Most, however, had a one-time commemoration that was not repeated. The first call for a yearly event came in 1866 from a Ladies group in Columbus, Georgia. General John Logan, Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, issued an order in 1868 setting May 30 as the day for "decorating" graves of those who died in the recent war.

As we mark the memory of the almost one million Americans who made that terrible sacrifice, we should always remember that each was an individual remembered by family and friends, as well as the nation. Pictured here is my maternal uncle, Robert William Jones. Born in 1926, he joined the Navy soon after his 17th birthday in 1943. He was trained as an aircraft mechanic and a crewman on a torpedo bomber. In January 1945, his aircraft failed to return from a ground support mission on the Northern Luzon in the Philippines. No trace of the aircraft or crew were ever found. He was just one of the hundreds of thousands mourned by their family until each, in turn passed away. I am comforted by the knowledge that he, and the others, will be remembered and honored by the nation long after we are gone.
